## Indianz.com... Venezuela dispatches troops to territory of 'feared' Wayuu Tribe

The government in Venezuela is cracking down on smuggling and immigration in the territory of the "feared" Wayuu Tribe, the Associated Press reports.

Tribal members don't recognize the Venezuela-Colombia border. They freely travel between both countries and engage in smuggling, which they don't view as a crime, according to the AP.

A lack of food and other items fuels smuggling. According to The Wall Street Journal, tribal members often wait in long lines for essentials like milk and

rice. Some days they walk away empty handed, the paper said.

Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro said he will respect the tribe's traditions even as he sent 3,000 troops to Wayuu territory. He closed border crossings and declared emergencies in three towns in the region, the AP reported.

Last month, troops conducted anti-smuggling raids in La Sibucara, a town in the border area. A reporter for the Wall Street Journal saw tribal members with bad injuries.

"They didn't say or ask us anything," Lisandro Uriana, a Wayuu father whose

home was raided, told the Journal. "They just beat us and we couldn't defend ourselves because they were armed and were many. I don't even smuggle... and now I can't even get up to work."

More than 437,000 Wayuu people live in Venezuela and Colombia, according to Wikipedia.

# I Was Thinking

## Thoughts from Frustration... by Lance Morgan



In 2011, some members of the Tribal Council asked me to make some suggestions on how we can improve the tribal economy. I wrote a memo that said I thought that one of the keys to Winnebago's rise was the development of multiple tribal corporations.

Entities such as Ho-Chunk, Inc., HCCDC, Little Priest Tribal College, the Winnebago Gaming Development Company, and the Tribal Housing Entity, were all formed to take care of specific tasks and they were a major part of our recent growth.

As this election is proving, the government can change and the people elected may not necessarily be the best people to run various entities. I wrote in 2011 that the tribe's decision to establish these entities has allowed us to maintain and grow our tribe regardless of the changes in the political winds. I suggested that the tribe consider forming more tribal entities focused on specific areas of growth such as land, natural resources, and housing. Nothing happened to my memo and I am not sure it was even read.

I was recently asked the question again by the new Tribal Council what I thought we could do to impact our community and I basically rewrote the old memo and submitted it again, but I think it was read this time.

The entity that was focused on first was the idea to establish a Winnebago Land and Management Company. The new company's sole purpose would be to manage and expand the tribal land base. The goal would be to try and buy back as much of the reservation as possible, which isn't exactly the worst thing I have ever heard in my life.

This idea has caused quite a stir and I keep hearing that Ho-Chunk, Inc. is trying to take over the Tribal Land. That isn't even close to reality. I am positive

Ho-Chunk, Inc. could manage the new entity if needed. However, under the proposal we would have nothing to do with it. Repeat. Ho-Chunk, Inc. would have nothing to do with it. If the tribe formed a land company then it will be an entity owned by the Tribe and managed by a separate board, just like all the other entities they have formed.

This idea is possible because the Cobell settlement will soon visit Winnebago and the Federal government will offer to purchase most of the fractionated interests on the reservation. The purchased land will be given to the Tribe, which will greatly increase tribal land income. This increase means it is likely the tribe can maintain its current income and still have money left over to buy more land. My suggestion was simple. Form a company to manage this land and give it the mission of expanding the land base and hopefully within a generation our land base will double.

This is a great idea, but all I hear is that Ho-Chunk, Inc. or Lance Morgan is trying to take over the tribal land, which is ridiculous. What annoys me and for some reason still surprises me after 20 years is that people will believe a lie a lot faster than the truth. This is especially so if it fits their preconceived negative view. This makes tribal members easy targets for people who don't mind lying to manipulate someone. The lie requires no proof and by the time people figure it out the election is usually over.

The real question to ask your self is do you support the idea of the tribe trying to buy back all of its land? If the answer is yes, then do you have a better idea than forming an entity whose sole mission is to expand the tribal land base? My guess is that the answer is you probably do support the idea as long as Ho-Chunk, Inc. isn't doing it and to be totally honest I couldn't agree more. I have plenty of others things to do.



# Winnebago Cross Country

# Around Winnebago

## Winnebago Housing And Development Commission

The WHDC has convened three meetings since the new appointments in late June. Orientation included the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-

Determination Act (NAHASDA) statute, the federal regulations for NAHASDA implementation, and the nine policies of the WHDC. These documents serve as the basis for the operation of the low-income housing program. The program is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through the Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG).

From August 18 through August 20, 2015, two staff from the HUD Office of Native American Programs conducted on-site monitoring of the housing program.

Their scope of work included review of each component of the program. The ONAP staff met with the WHDC board members and informed them of the details of the review. ONAP staff reviewed tenant files to be sure that all required documents were in the files, the maintenance work order system, the financial transactions and internal control procedures. Procurement and travel files, minutes of the board meetings to name a few. During the exit interview with staff and one board member ONAP staff related that operations are doing acceptable work; that recommendations for updates and improvements are important and do

not infer serious deficiencies.

On August 25, 2015 the mandatory annual inspection of the Thunder Way Low-Income Housing Tax Credit project was conducted by the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority and the Midwest Housing Equity Group, Inc. The exterior of the total project and the interior of three units and all tenant files were inspected. A report will be sent to WHDC; the verbal report indicated no serious issues.

On September 1, 2015 the federal audit required by HUD began with arrival of Melissa Petersen, C.P.A. and her partner. Ms. Petersen also held an Entry Interview with the WHDC board, and exit interview with administrative staff and one board member before she left Winnebago on September 3. Once again, there were recommendations for updates on policies and procedures, and no serious deficiencies for the WHDC.

It's been a busy time with staff pulling files and reports randomly selected by the various parties and a great addition to the new WHDC board's learning experience.

The new board members have a positive attitude as they learn about the program, and we are all looking forward to finalizing the renovation plan for Rainbow Housing Project.




