Winnebago Wrestlers Place at Lewis and Clark Conference



The Winnebago Indians Wrestling Team standout, Derrell Zagurski has been busy this season, falling & pinning his way to a 10-11 record. Derrell and his Winnebago teammates recently competed in the Lewis & Clark Conference meet and placed 8th at the Meet. "Can you smell what Derrell is cooking?"

The Winnebago Indian Wrestlers headed to Plainview on Jan 21 for the Lewis and Clark Conference Tournament. It would be one for the record books for the young Indians. 8 wrestlers would compete for Conference royalty top 4 earns a medal. One of the best things that happened didn't come from one of the boys that placed it came from the 145lb wrestler Wyatt Lopez. Wyatt has had some very close matches this year and just could not turn the corner and get the victory things would be different here though. Wyatt had a tough start to the day losing his first two matches. His 3rd match would change his entire season. Lopez faced off against Stanley that he lost to last week in the dual and knew he would have his number but his luck about ran out. While wrestling Wyatt had 4 penalty points through the first 2 periods and if he had one more he would be disqualified from the match. Lopez understood what was at hand he was up 11-6 and his first wrestling win ever. The 3rd period starts and Lopez fires in on a shot and takes down Stanley and quickly throws in a half and turns him and gets the pin for his first victory. "Wyatt has worked extremely hard the last 2 weeks and he deserves this for his efforts. I could not imagine how good he could have been if he would have wrestled for the last 4 years it would have been neat to see", said Coach Tranmer. Lopez ended the day losing his next match and getting a forfeit win at the end to go 2-3 on the day. Tyrese

Gorin who usually wrestles at 132 was bumped up to 138 for the tourney. "I always look at the best possible scenario for each kid to have the best opportunity to earn a medal," said Coach Tranmer. This move worked out perfectly. Tyrese got 2 pins and earned a 4th place medal. Brendan Catches had 4 guys in his bracket at 195 and was guaranteed a 4th place medal. He was winless on the day but still got a medal. Derrell Zagurski entered the day 10-11 and with that record he earned the #1 seed at 285. He showed he was worthy of that seed in the first two matches by earning pins in each. He then faced Grimaldo from Wakefield. Derrell tried a headlock and just didn't get his hips turned fast enough and ended up losing by fall. Now it was go time if Derrell won his final match he would have 2nd place locked up. Derrell was tied up with Nelson from Plainview and absolutely launches him and puts him to his back for his 3rd victory and pin for the day earning the 2nd place medal. Other participants were Jamisen Wolfleaderat 120 going 0-4 due to injury, Toby 126 0-4, Nick Painter 182 0-5, and Kalief Harden 220 0-5 due to injury. The team broke the team record for Team Points in a tourney with 65 points and ended up in 8th out of 9 teams in the conference. **Zagurcules Sighting in Arlington** Winnebago Wrestling team headed down to Arlington on Jan 16th for the Arlington Invitational. Due to injuries

and illness hitting the team hard the squad had 3 participants. Wyatt Lopez at 145 took the mat for the Indians and battled all day. He would come up short in the two matches he had to go 0-2 on the day. Nick Painter wrestled at 182 and would also come up short in his matches and go 0-2 on the day. Bago's Derrell Zagurski (who they call Zagurcules) at 285 had his best day of his season so far going 3-1 on the day. In the 2nd round he faced Hansen from North Bend and would lose by fall but in the match he showed signs that he could beat the 17-11 Hansen. In the wrestle backs Zagurcules was sighted in Arlington. Derrell was on a mission to get his record close to .500 for the season and it would mean that he would have to win the last 3 matches of the day. He did it in epic fashion, getting a pin over Schneider of Mount Michael, and Madsen of Fremont Bergan to make it into the 3rd-4th place match. Here he would face Hansen again and the battle would be won by Zagurski this time. After a hard fought two and a half periods Derrell would get the best of Hansen and get a pin for the victory and a 3rd place finish. This win took Derrell's record to 10-11 just under .500 and a big opportunity to get above .500 at the Lewis and Clark Conference Tournament. Coach Tranmer stated "Derrell is very deceiving he looks like a big ol' teddy bear but he is a beast and when Zagurcules comes out to wrestle watch out he is dangerous and the B-1 district better be watching out for him."

What you need to know before you File your Taxes

With income tax season upon us are you aware that every person needs to have health coverage or make a payment on their federal income tax return called "shared responsibility payment"?

However if you have a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe or is an Indian eligible for services through the Indian Health Service, tribes and tribal organizations, and urban Indian organizations, you are exempt from paying this fee. In order to obtain this exemption you must apply through the Marketplace or by claiming the exemption on your annual federal income tax return.

Remember some people don't have to file a tax return if their household income is below the filing threshold.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Each person who wants this exemption needs to provide documents showing tribal membership, Alaska Native corporation shareholder status, or eligibility for services from the Indian Health Service, a tribal health care provider, or an urban Indian health care provider.

You will also need a copy of both sides of any cards and all pages of documentation you provide with the application.

You will need Social Security Numbers (SSNs), if they're available to you.

Indiansz.com... Senate Indian Affairs Committee expands look into 'substandard' care at Indian Health Service

UPDATE: Due to the blizzard that has hampered travel to and from Washington, D.C., the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs has postponed the oversight hearing and listening session to February 3. The business meeting also has been postponed to February 3.

The Senate Indian Affairs Committee is expanding its inquiry into the "substandard" level of care at the Indian Health Service.

The panel is holding an oversight hearing next Wednesday into the Great Plains Area at the agency. Tribes in the region -- particularly those in Nebraska and South Dakota -- have consistently complained about management failures

and cutbacks in service that have contributed to serious problems at hospitals and clinics on their reservations.

To address the concerns, five top officials from the Department of Health and Human Services will appear before the committee. Included is Robert G. McSwain, the de facto director of the IHS who has promised to bring change and improve accountability in the region, according to leaders of the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska who have met with him and his staff during frequent trips to Washington, D.C.

The Obama administration witnesses will be joined by a second panel of tribal leaders and tribal members who have experienced problems in the region firsthand. Recent changes include a cut-back in services at the Rosebud Service

Unit, which serves the Rosebud Sioux Tribe in South Dakota, along with a loss of Medicare funding at the Winnebago Service Unit, which serves the Omaha Tribe and the Winnebago Tribe. But the Great Plains won't be the sole focus of the committee's work. Following the hearing, lawmakers and staff will host a listening session to hear about problems facing the IHS in other parts of Indian Country.

The proceedings mark the first significant national review in decades of the agency that is charged with providing health care to millions of American Indians and Alaska Natives. Although the IHS budget has increased year to year, it remains the target of complaints across the nation.

fied staff at the hospital. However, like all of us I have heard enough strange stories that I don't go there regularly and take my kids elsewhere unless it is an emergency. I have medical insurance and can go elsewhere if I so choose, but a lot of people in our community are forced to use IHS because they don't have the economic resources to go elsewhere, and therefore, we need our community hospital operating at a high level.

These allegations are not just rumors or things frustrated family members are saying. The government has been issuing these reports from various sources for 5 years. Being cut off by Medicare might be the wake up call that IHS needs. Certainly the Tribe going to DC and having the US Senate have a committee hearing will get their attention, but will it really work in the long term?

The federal government has created a giant bureaucracy that protects it's own. If you make mistakes, they are minimized. If you are a bad employee, then the trick is to transfer you to somewhere else because it is so difficult to fire anyone. If there is a problem, then hide behind rules. None of these things helps create better care, but they do protect the bureaucratic machine and weak employees.

Because this is a high profile issue and embarrassing to IHS, I am sure they will do whatever it takes to get the certification back, but really I don't have a ton of confidence it will work long term because the underlying bureaucratic system that allowed this situation to develop is still in place.

The Tribe has decided its option for real change is to enter in to compact negotiations to take the hospital over using what is known as the 638 process. I am a strong believer in the Tribe controlling its own destiny, but this move makes me nervous too. I think we will have a steep learning curve at first and risk having our own set of problems initially, but in the end I would rather risk a few bumps along the way because no one will care more than us and that will eventually push up our standard of care. In the meantime, I hope we get to the point where our people don't have to second guess going to the hospital in our own community.

Bago Wrestlers let Laurel Concord "Escape" with a Dual Victory

The Winnebago Wrestlers took the mat in the Inaugural home Wrestling Dual against Laurel Concord on January 11th for parents night to honor the fine student athletes whom have made a commitment to wrestle in the first year of the wrestling program. Two Seniors were honored Wyatt Lopez 145 and Kalief Harden 220. For those of you who don't know how a Dual works each team puts a wrestler out on the mat for the weight class and they wrestle it out to see who is the better wrestler at that weight class. The Dual started at 106 where neither team had anyone to wrestle. The same at 113. At 120 Tobias Thomas got a forfeit win and 6 team points to put Winnebago up 6-0. 126 was next and Jamisen Wolfleader took the mat for the Indians where again Laurel did not have a competitor at that weight so Jamisen got a forfeit win and Bago was up 12-0. At 132 both teams again were open (no wrestlers). At 138 though Winnebago's Tyrese Gorrin came out on a mission against Evan Urwiler from Laurel. Tyrese gets the HUGE PIN for the victory earning 6 more points for the Indians and giving us a 18 point lead. The next match at 145 was the match of the night, where Winnebago's Wyatt Lopez was facing off against Charles Stanley. Lopez came out scoring first with a quick takedown for 2 points. Stanley gets a 2 point reversal but the nifty Lopez gets an escape for 1 point. Wyatt answers with a takedown with 9 seconds left in the first period and holds on to have a 5-2 lead heading into the 2nd period. Coach Tranmer has Wyatt go neutral to start the 2nd. Lack of experience and conditioning came into play, Stanley gets a cheap takedown to narrow the score to 5-4 but then locks his hands to give Lopez a penalty point so it is 6-4. Lopez scrambles and almost gets to his feet when Stanley catches him in a move to his back and gets the fall. "We had taken the kid down twice and battled hard I thought we could do it again in the 2nd period and mentally break the kid but a sloppy attempt kept Wyatt from getting that takedown and we were just out wrestled

To start the new year the JV wrestling team brought home some medals from the Wisner JV tourney on January 3. Prosper Gilpin 285, Nick Saunsoci 285, and Colleen Cook took 2nd place. Prosper got a pin for a win in the first round and then lost to Plainview in the final match going 1-1 on the day. Nick had to wrestle Jaylen Harden in the first round and came out with a pin for a win then lost his next match by fall earning 2nd place and a 1-1 record. The Indians hosted Laurel in a dual on January 8th in between the girls and boys basketball game, then on January 9th headed back to Wisner for the Wisner Invite.

Gorri's 2nd Place Finish Leads 5 Medalists to School Record

On December 19th the Wrestling Team headed to the Swamp at Wisner for the Green Machine Invite. 8 boys took to the mat for the Indians that set a new school record for team points with 29 and a 4th place finish. Tyrese Gorri (132) came out on fire and pinned Otterberg from Elkhorn to head to the finals where he would face off against Berlin from Wisner. Tyrese showed his overall improvement so far this year by going almost two full periods with a kid he lost to very fast the week before. Tyrese ended up losing the match and came home with a 2nd place medal and a 1-1 record, the first of many for the young grappler. Kalief Harden (220) started off slow but was hungry for wins at the end of the day and a medal. He lost three matches in the morning session before getting back on track with a pin over Ellis of Wayne. This set up a final match with Morgan of Elkhorn to decide who would come home with a 4th place medal and Kalief took care of business with a fall in 1:23 to get his first medal ever and a 2-3 record. Brendan Catches (195) came home with a 4th place finish in a 4 man bracket but worked very hard in every match going 0-3. Brendan shows heart in every match he wrestles. Jamisen Wolfeader (120) got his first ever win with a pin over Thomas of Winnebago and solidified his first ever medal a 4th place finish and a 1-3 record. Derrell Zagurski (285) started a streak of placing at tournaments with a 3rd place finish. Derrell got pins over Saunsoci of Winnebago and Pura of Omaha Bryan to earn his medal and a 2-3 record. Each one of these boys helped rack up the 29 team points showing the growth from the 9 point finish the week before at North Bend. Other participants were Toby Thomas (120) 0-4, Nick Sausoci (285) 0-4, Nick Painter (182) 0-4.

Zagurski and Gilpin Bring Home Medals and 10th Place Finish

The wrestlers headed to Pierce on Dec. 30 for the Pierce Invite. The weather and Christmas break limited the teams entries into the tournament 7 wrestlers would compete. Jamisen Wolfeader had a tough day going 0-4 on the day finishing 5th earning 3 team points. Tyrese Gorri placed 6th getting 2 more wins by pin and earning 12 team points. Kalief Harden had a tough bracket and earned 5th place with 3 team points on the day. Nick Painter had one of the most stacked brackets at 182 going 0-4 on the day. Nick Saunsoci competing for the first time this year wrestled well for his first meet going 0-4. Derrell Zagurski kept up his hot streak bringing home a 3rd place medal at 285 with two pins for wins against Gilpin of Winnebago and a pin and win over Paulsen of Hartington CC. Derrell went 3-1 on the day and did a great job earning 24 team points. Prosper Gilpin also got his experience of a wrestling tourney and showed that he has a lot of potential. Wrestling as a JV wrestler at 285 he lost by fall to Zagurski of Winnebago but fired back with his first pin and win over Paulsen of Hartington CC. Prosper has so much natural ability that has yet to be released and with time in the wrestling room and a lot of hard work he can become a very good wrestler. Prosper had some close opportunities to upset the number 2 seed in the tournament but just missed them so it set up a 3rd/4th place rematch with Derrell, where he would not come out on top. This was the best team performance by the young Indian Wrestlers they scored a new school record 42 team points showing how the weeks of practice are helping form a great first year squad. The team ended up in 10th place out of 13 teams on the day.



At 195 Brendan Catches was facing off against Dietrich from Laurel where he would lose by fall in the first period and Laurel had the lead in the dual for the first time 18-24. One of the Senior boys would take the mat at 220 despite a nagging rib injury to face off against the # 6 ranked Nolan Casey and would lose by fall, Laurel had now locked up the dual it was 18-30. "Kalief was a warrior tonight, his ribs were hurting but he wasn't going to let that stop him from wrestling in front of his family, friends and the community of Winnebago. I was so proud of him and hope he knows that," said Coach Tranmer. The final match of the night was at 285 where Derrell Zagurski would match up against Ethan Williams

from Laurel. Derrell had been a little under the weather the last week or so but he blasted right out of that like a solar flare to put Williams on his back and got the pin in 1 minute 9 seconds.

"The boys faced off and battled hard I was so proud of each and everyone of them. I wish all of you could have seen them wrestle the first weekend and then see them now....they have grown so much, learned so much and shocked so many people it is just impressive." stated Coach Tranmer. "Coach Maxwell from Laurel told me we have some scrappers on the team and in a few years we are going to be really tough Winnebago surprised us at a few weight classes and have tough kids that don't give up." said Mr Tranmer.
