


Indianz.com... Three tribes enter cooperative for buy-back program

Wednesday, may 25th , 2016

Three more tribes have joined the Land Buy-Back for tribal nations. The bad river band of the Lake Superior of Chippewa Indians Wisconsin, and the Winnebago tribe of Nebraska and the Yakama Nation in Washington signed cooperative agreements with the Interior Department. The tribes will help educate individuals Indians landowners about the program.
"The success of the Buy-Back Program is in our ongoing collaboratios with tribal governments and active outreach to individual owners," Duty Secretary Micheal Connor said in a

press release. "we know that tribal leaders can best explain the significant benefit and planned use of consolidated lands for the community. We are committed to make sure that individuals are aware of this historic opportunity to strengthen tribal sovereignty and keep land in trust by consolidating fractional interests."
The \$3.4 billion settlement to the Indian trust fund lawsuit included \$1.9billion for landowners who want to sell their fractionated interests. The Indian Land Consolidation Act requires the federal government to pay "fair market value" for the interests.
As of May 20th , nearly 73,000 landowners have received a total

of \$743 million for their interests. The equivalent of nearly 1.5 million acres has been returned to tribes as a result.
H.R.7483, the law the implemented the settlement, requires the land consolidation fund to be spent in ten years. The money will run out before the deadline if the current rate of sales continues.
Secretary Sally Jewell has asked for options to extend land consolidation efforts beyond that deadline.

Zika fever

A disease caused by Zika virus that's spread through mosquito bites **Extremely rare** Fewer than 1,000 US cases per year. Requires a medical diagnosis, Lab tests or imaging often required. Spreads by animals or insects
Short-term: resolves within days to weeks.

In most cases, there are no symptoms. In a few cases, Zika can trigger paralysis (Guillain-Barré Syndrome). In pregnant women, it may cause subsequent birth defects.

When present, symptoms are mild and last less than a week. They include fever, rash, joint pain, and red eyes.

There's no vaccine or specific treatment. Instead the focus is on relieving symptoms and includes rest, rehydration, and acetaminophen for fever and pain. Aspirin and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) like ibuprofen should be avoided.

How it spreads By animal or insect bites or stings. By having unprotected sex. Symptoms: Requires a medical diagnosis.

When present, symptoms are mild and last less than a week. They include fever, rash, joint pain, and red eyes.

Can have no symptoms, but people may experience:

Pain areas: in the back of the eyes, joints, or muscles.

Whole body: fatigue, fever, chills, loss of appetite, or sweating

Also common: eye redness, headache, skin rash, or vomiting.


Treatments: There's no vaccine or specific treatment. Instead the focus is on relieving symptoms and includes rest, rehydration, and acetaminophen for fever and pain. Aspirin and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) like ibuprofen should be avoided.

Medications

Analgesic: Relieves pain.
Acetaminophen (Tylenol)
Antihistamine: Reduces or stops an allergic reaction.
Diphenhydramine (Benadryl)

Infectious disease doctor: Treats infections, including those that are tropical in nature.
Travel medicine: Manages health concerns for international travelers.
Primary care provider (PCP): Prevents, diagnoses, and treats diseases.

The annual youth summit was held on May 26th at the Winnebago Public school. The topic at the town hall meeting was on 'Underage Drinking.' Two people stood up and in their own way, the first attempting not to 'offend' anyone, placed the blame on 'my people.' The second was a Ho-Chunk elder who accused St. Augustine Indian mission who she remembers at the age of five offered wine on their altar as promoting drinking. Jesus Our Savior Lutheran church offers the forgiveness of sins through the eating of consecrated bread and the drinking of consecrated wine, using the words and the means that Jesus Christ instituted on the night that He was betrayed prior to His death on the cross. It is a memorial meal and so much more.

I did not express myself at that time for various reasons, the main one was that another Ho-Chunk elder stood and spoke up on the issue and pointed out that the Jesus, the Son of God, had changed water into wine. He went on to make the point that made us realize that none of us is perfect and that all of us are truly related. (I would add and in need of a Savior).

The other reason I did not speak up, besides my apparent timidity, was that I have learned these words from James: 'Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness that God requires. Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls' [James 1:19-21 ESV].

God's Sacred Word has much to say about getting drunk:

Who has woe? Who has sorrow?

Kelly Pond Update

Spring is here once again, temperatures are warming up and folks are getting back to their summertime activities. This being the case, it is a good time to remind everyone that there is still a 'Fish Consumption Rate' posted at Kelly Pond. Please look at the table below to find out what fish are safer than others to eat.

Note: Consumption limits for Non-cancer Health Endpoints are based on an adult weight of 150 pounds eating a one-half pound or 8 ounce (precooked weight) meal. To adjust the meal size for a lighter or heavier weight just subtract or add an ounce of fish for every 20 pounds of body weight.

Example: 170 lb. Adult = 9 oz.

80 lb Child = 4 oz.

Even though, the guidelines recommend 1 meal per month, you can divide by four to get rates in meals per week or eat smaller sized meals over the month. Also, be sure to space out meals throughout the month. For example, don't eat all your fish meals for the entire month within a few days.

Please, don't throw fish caught in other areas into Kelly Pond.

Also, please remind children that Kelly Pond is not a safe place to swim. Many areas along the shore have water plants growing that can tangle and trap a child and there are several places where the water gets deeper quickly.
