Winnebago Tribal Council Welcomes New Chairman



Members of the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska this week voted and elected a new member to the Winnebago Tribal Council. Mr. Coly Brown was successful in his bid for a seat on the Winnebago Tribal Council, taking the seat of incumbent Louis LaRose. Brown was joined in the Election by incumbents Kenn Mallory and Frank White. White topped all Candidates with 182 votes, followed by Mallory with 161 and Brown with 160.

At a Reorganizational meeting held on Wednesday, October 5th, Mr. Frank White was elected by his peers to serve as the new Winnebago Tribal Council Chairman. Other officers elected were; Vince Bass- Vice Chairman, Kenn Mallory-Secretary and Victoria Kitcheyan-Tribal Treasurer.

Indianz.com... Standing Rock Sioux Tribe fires back as court hears #NoDAPL case

The Standing Rock Sioux Tribe isn't letting last-minute filing from the backers of the controversial Dakota Access Pipeline go unanswered.

Sacred sites and burial grounds were bulldozed by construction crews on September 3, Jon Eagle Sr., the tribe's historic preservation officer asserted on Tuesday.

"This terrible and intentional action was taken without consulting with tribal or state historic preservation officials," Eagle said in a sworn declaration to the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals.

But Eagle said no one from the

tribe was allowed to visit the area in question even though the State Historical Society of North Dakota sent a team of seven archaeologists there on September 21. According to a one-page memo that was submitted to the court on the eve of a critical hearing, no "cultural material" or ancestral remains were found.

A one-page memo, accompanied by a map and three photos, was prepared after seven archaeologists from the State Historical Society of North Dakota visited a Dakota Access Pipeline construction site on September 21, 2016.

Eagle, however, said there's a simple explanation for that: Dakota Access had already destroyed those sites. During a September 26 meeting in which the state memo was discussed, he

compared the area the seven archaeologists visited to the survey previously submitted by Tim Mentz Sr., a well-respected tribal cultural expert.

"I was able to show the state and federal officials that substantial portions of a stone feature and sacred site identified by Tim Mentz on September 2, were gone - either damaged or destroyed by the bulldozing and grading done by Dakota Access on September 3," Eagle told the court. "The comparison made clear that portions of the sacred site, including burial cairn that Mr. Mentz identified, were gone."

Eagle also questioned how Paul Picha, North Dakota's chief archaeologist and the author of the one-page memo, knew that no burial grounds were harmed during construction.

"I asked whether they had taken apart the berms created by the bulldozing, and Mr. Picha said they had not," Eagle said in his declaration. "I asked how he could state that there were no human remains without examining the berms."

Dakota Access LLC, the partnership behind the pipeline, has since purchased the land in question from a rancher who had invited Mentz to examine the property in late August. The tribe disclosed the dramatic cultural finds on September 2 and a widely-seen confrontation between #NoDAPL resisters and construction crews on September 3 helped draw more attention to the cause.

The sacred sites and burial grounds are a key issue as the D.C. Circuit meets on Wednesday morning for the hearing, which takes place at 9:30am Eastern in Courtroom 31 of the federal courthouse.

“Parenthood: a Holy Calling”

And when Esau lifted up his eyes and saw the women and children, he said, “Who are these with you?” Jacob said, “The children whom God has graciously given your servant.” [Genesis 33:5 ESV]

Esau and Jacob were brothers who had been apart for over twenty years. Esau had sold his birth right as the ‘Kunu’ first born son to ‘Hayna’ his younger brother. Then Jacob had deceived their father Isaac into blessing him over Esau. Esau had vowed to murder his brother, and now the time had come for the two to meet one another. Esau came with over 400 men.

The drama of this meeting may overlook the profound answer that Jacob responds with to the question regarding the women and children. Jacob had been blessed to have eleven sons and one daughter at this time, as well as having two wives and two female servants who also were mothers to his offspring. Here we hear a powerful testimony that it is God who gives children, and not men and women who produce them. These children are not objects but are “graciously given,” bestowed on a “servant.”

Understanding that a child is a gift from God gives one a completely different perspective on the news of conception. The unborn child is not to be considered a ‘problem’ or a ‘mistake’ or even ‘unplanned’ at least not by God. Each and every child is precious in the sight of Creator God. With the gift of a child comes the God-given calling of becoming a parent.

Parenthood is a God-given extension of the one-flesh union. A family is one flesh! The parents are unified in marriage and sexual union, and children spring from that union. The father’s DNA—in which is encoded every aspect of his body—combines with the mother’s DNA, in which is encoded every aspect of her body. The result of this combination is a completely new, individual human being. And yet, the child, while having his or her own uniqueness, nevertheless shares the flesh—quite literally—with the mother and the father.

Through the mother, God works through her body to nourish and protect the child both before and after the baby is born. Through the father, God works to protect and support the mother and child. God joins them together to share the work of parents: providing daily bread, protection, guidance, and instruction.

Thus the vocation (the God-given call) of parenthood for us is very physical. It begins with our flesh and results in another mouth to feed and a body to protect. It means holding the child, soothing the child, and meeting the needs of the child. Caring for a child can be dirty, exhausting, and stressful.

God is loving and serving the child, even changing and cleaning the child, through the parent’s love and service. As so the parent is fulfilling a holy vocation. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Part 4

Grandma and Joe are having a lunch of left over soup and Ms. Greengrass's biscuits. "You know something about that Mr. Kotter sure reminds me of your great grandpa. I was just a little girl then but he was such a kind man I can still see his eyes. He used to bring me two of those little orange peanut candies when he came to visit my mom. Mom would always make him pork chops-he sure liked pork chops.

The next day Shelly and Marisa are talking at school and Marissa wants to know if Mike is going out with anyone. Shelly gives her a surprised look but doesn't answer. Marissa gets a little mad and says she heard the teachers went to their house yesterday. Why are they trying to help-they're not even Indian.

Shelly says Ms. Greengrass is Indian and her grandma likes her and needs some help with Mike. I thought so too and is why I talked to Hawk's dad. Marissa says she knows what will help Mike-a party! He just needs to hook-up with someone. Marissa gets all excited and Shelly starts to buy in to the party idea. She says the party can be at her house because her mom is never home and her brothers won't tell. I know some boys who can get some beer and I can pinch some of mom's weed-unless you have money then we can get a bag.

Mike stayed over at Hawks the night before. All he could talk about at lunch was the cool skateboard Hawk has but never uses. When Marissa tells him of the party that night he's not sure what to do but Shelly seems to go for it so he does too. Besides, there were gonna be some guys in his class there and he thought it might be okay to get to know them better.

Mike and Shelly tell grandma they are going to the youth center and she tells them to stay together. When they get to Marissa's some of the boys are already pretty buzzed up and everyone is laughing. Soon the beer runs out. One of the boys says he's gonna make a beer run-who wants to go? Mike and Shelly give each other a startled look and jump up.

Mike tells the guys they can't drive you're gonna get picked up. One of the boys says, no I got my dad's car and the cops won't even look to see who's driving. You worried you're grandma's gonna get mad? I just think it's a bad idea and you don't need to go. Another boy heads for the door and the two of them walk out.

Mike grabs Shelly and they head out the door. They are talking on the way

home, mostly about how what just happened made them think. Maybe Marissa's idea wasn't so great after all.

Part 5

Once Mike and Shelley get home they hear the sirens. Mike can't wait to hear and calls Marissa. She says "The boys got in an accident. They are on their way to the hospital in the city. No one knows anything else-but they are alive. They rolled the vehicle two times." Mike throws up and both he and Shelly head for bed feeling sick. Their Grandma is sound asleep in bed.

When Mike and Shelley meet in the kitchen the next morning they look at each other with tears in their eyes. They are not sure what to do-how to feel. Did someone else risk their lives for a beer? What makes people do that? They want to run and hide and make it all not be true. Mike feels numb but his skin feels like if someone touched it he would burst into flames. His stomach feels like it's turning into a little tiny walnut and it's getting harder to breathe. Shelly brings him out of his trance and says "We better go to school. I know you don't want to- neither do I, but if we don't and we're not sick Grandma and Jesse will think something's wrong. So much has been happening to us."

At school they hear that Bill broke his leg and won't play football the rest of the season. Tom broke his arm and he's out too. Mike takes a seat next to Hawk and tells him everything about the party. "You know I went to the party mostly cause I wanted to be friends with those guys, they're the ones that hate me at school. I just wanted them to like me. I knew drinking wasn't going to help. You know, I'm not sure why I went. When the guys were talking about going for more beer it was weird. I had flashbacks. I thought of my mom and dad and how they were on a beer run when they got in the accident. I don't know how much more I can take." Mike covers his face and Hawk is scared. He knows there is something really wrong. He thinks of his Dad, puts his arm around Mike's shoulder and says, "It's okay Mike. Everything will be okay. We'll see my Dad. He'll know what to do."

Hawk thinks Mike should come out to his place right after school. He'll walk with him to tell his Grandma and then they'll walk to his house. Mr. Kotter see's that something's going on with Mike and Shelley-more than the bad

news about the accident. At lunch he asks what's up. Mike turns around and sees more than his teacher-he sees a friend...and something more. He turns and runs.

Mr. Kotter chases after him and at the end of the block Mike stops, turns around and starts crying-hard. Mr. Kotter does what he feels in his heart, holds him by his shoulders, and then hugs him to comfort him. He feels his heart breaking too. Mr Kotter says, "I don't know what's going on but I want to help. You know I do or I wouldn't have gone to visit your Grandma with Ms. Greengrass. Your Grandma liked me and I liked her. If you have a problem I want to help solve it. Please." Mike is still unable to talk. Mr. Kotter is patient. Mike starts calming down and they both sit on the curb.

They are both quiet. Mike starts by

saying, "Shelley and I were at the party where Bill and Tom were drinking. I tried to stop them... (there was a long silence) just like I tried to stop my Mom and Dad, but they wouldn't listen. It's my fault I should have tried harder to stop them, start a fight with them... anything but let them leave."

Mr. Kotter is shocked, saddened and scared. Shocked to find out Mike was involved. Saddened because of what Mike and his family had already gone through, and scared because how was he going to help this family when he had his own problems?

When they get back to the classroom its almost time to leave for the day. Mr. Kotter tells Mike and Hawk he will give them a ride to Grandma's and then to Hawk's house.






