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## Zagurski Puts a Stamp on Senior Year: Places 6th at State Tourney, Finishes 38th of 60 in Team Standings

Derrell finished his high school career with one last medal and became one of the main attractions at the NSAA State tourney. The medal he earned may not have been the one him or the coaches believe he should have gotten but he got a State Medal and that is what we were all proud of. Derrell entered the State meet ranked #3 and had a great draw to make a serious run at getting to the State Finals and it would have been if not for a knee injury on Friday night.

In the first round Derrell came out and took care of Powells from Yutan with a few takedowns and a 2nd period pin. The Quarterfinal match was the one that he needed to win. A win would put him in the Semi-Finals on Friday night and guarantee a State medal. Derrell came out and got a feeling of what Moses from Filmore Central was doing and took Moses down late in the first period. A second period reversal by Moses put Derrell in a spot but a quick escape put Big Z up 3-2. Third period starting and Derrell's choice where a standup reversal put Moses on his back for pin#2 for Zagurski and made him the first ever medalist for the Indians. After the match Derrell said the the coaches, "I was just giving him hope coach", talking about letting Moses reverse him and be in control for a bit in the 2nd period. Winning the first 2 matches put Derrell in the Semis against Jerebek from Arcadia/Loup City where we knew he had a really good chance at beating Jerebek and getting to the State Finals. "We had great game plan", said Coach Tranmer, heading into the Semi Final match. "Derrell told me he was gonna feel him out to see what he was going to do and then he was going to blast double him. I agreed and told him we need to do that the entire match Let's put on a show". Well a bit of that happened the feeling out and blast doubling the kid but doing it over and over didn't get to happen. Derrell took Jerebek down and they scrambled out of bounds. "There was 30 sec or so left in the first period and I thought he was in a good spot, in control riding him, and didn't want to give up a cheap point so I didn't tell him to let him up." stated Coach Tranmer. On the restart Jerebek hit a switch and Derrell got caught in a bad spot where Jerebek fired back into Derrell on a low single and that would be where the state meet would change for Derrell. Derrell's knee was hurt and he wrestled the 2nd and 3rd period on a hurt knee. "The kid showed his heart in that match. I felt terrible when he lost cause Derrell was the better wrestler everyone knew that. The roof would have blown off this place if Derrell would have won that match Friday night." "Derrell was the talk of the tourney when everyone found out



he had only wrestled for 3 years and was one match away from the finals they all took notice." Derrell was interviewed many times and made the community proud of him.

Derrell's loss put him in an 8:30 am match on Saturday morning against Thompson from Battle Creek. "We didn't know what Derrell was going to be able to do on Saturday morning but the adrenaline did kick in and he tried to give it a go." He didn't have the movement or the stability but he tried losing a 5-3 in OT. He would medically forfeit his last match and earned him a 6th place medal. "His goal was to get to the Finals and he came up just short of that. His final placing doesn't show that but he was so close and this one will sit with me as a coach for awhile", stated Tranmer. Many kids wrestle for years and years 10-12 years really and dream of qualifying for State hoping to earn a state medal. Most of them may get there but don't medal and to have Derrell wrestle for 3 years and earn a medal is pretty special. "There are not alot if kids like Derrell especially in this sport. He watches his matches over and over to figure out what he did wrong or what he could do better. Whatever college gets him as a wrestler

is gonna get a really good one. He is a great kid and to have a kid like that be the face of this program I can take that for sure. He really wanted to win but when you are hurt you can't help it and it was unfortunate it happened to him." Derrell Zagurski has had a 3 year career in the Winnebago Wrestling program that most kids dream of for a 4 year career. He ended up with a career record of 114-30, 123 takedowns, and 87 pins along with almost every other school record individual and career in wrestling.

Derrell didn't just make an impression on his school and community it has reached out across Nebraska. "There are people still talking about Derrell and his story a few days later in Omaha and in Lincoln. It has been a great ride this young man has taken us on and I have learned just as much as he has." Coach Tranmer said.

Derrell finished with 11 points as a team and finished 38th out of 60 teams in Class C. It was a great experience and hope this continues for years to come. A huge THANK YOU to all that have supported Derrell over the last 3 years helping him get to camps and on National Teams he could not have done this without you.

## Indianz.com... Candidate vows to approve Ho-Chunk Nation off-reservation casino



A decision is still far away but a candidate for governor in Wisconsin says he will approve an off-reservation casino for the Ho-Chunk Nation if he wins the election in November.

Tony Evers, the superintendent of the state's public school system, is the "leading" Democratic candidate in the race, The Beloit Daily News reported. He told the paper that he will support the long-delayed casino in Beloit.

"I would sign that agreement," Evers told the paper.

The tribe is pursuing the \$405.5

million casino under the two-part determination provisions of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. The law requires approval from the state governor in addition to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Scott Walker, a Republican, is running for re-election. He has not stated a position on the casino, though he rejected a two-part determination casino for the Menominee Nation way back in 2015.

The Ho-Chunk Nation's project enjoys strong local support. So did the Menominee Nation's but that effort was

complicated by opposition from rival tribes, including the Ho-Chunks.

The BIA has yet to issue a draft environmental impact statement for the Ho-Chunk casino. Tribal leaders are hopeful that action will take place within the next month or so.

## Letter to the Editor...

**"Defend Big Tobacco and their Nebraska Cronies"**

On January 30th scores of agents from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, who were armed and wearing body armor, converged on Ho-Chunk Inc. in Winnebago. I am not quite certain why. Was it to face down drug lords and murderers, to stop a plot to overthrow our democracy or to settle a simple tax dispute?

Any way you see it, it was an over-reaction! It was provocative, it was needless, but above all it violated the sovereignty of the Winnebago people. Is this what you think of us I would ask? One can be subtle or in my face but in either case I know the answer!

I have heard of no public outcry in response to the outrageous and misguided assault on the sovereign Winnebago people. Not from the congressional delegation. Not from State Senators, public officials, my fellow Nebraskans or any Americans for that fact! It seems like it is always the Indians versus their neighbors or my Winnebago people versus the whole world! We have always faced those odds but because we want to live, to grow and to flourish we do! Our forebears faced them and we have to face them! But why must our children and the generations to come have to suffer from "old attitudes" and old ideas that the dominant culture has about us?

The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms came to Winnebago, to secure some records to seemingly strengthen their legal position in a tobacco case that is many years old and where a dispute about Tribal sovereignty has arisen. The question of whether or not other governments can tax what our people manufacture was the issue. ATF came to enforce the Constitution! The raid must have been impressive! Scores of armed agents stormed the offices of Ho-Chunk Inc., the Tribe's economic development arm, in a dramatic show of force...to carry out boxes? The Department of Justice, the U.S. Attorney and their cronies at the State Capitol and at Phillip Morris will surely issue awards and citations for those involved in the "lightning raid". Training tapes will probably be made.

They certainly showed the receptionists and custodians who had arrived early who was boss and showed all Nebraskans that they will go to great lengths to protect and defend Big Tobacco and their Nebraska cronies, err...I mean the U.S. Constitution!

Ironically, on the same night that ATF still occupied a building on sovereign Winnebago Indian lands my son called me from Washington, DC where he stood at the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial looking for the name of his uncle, my brother Anthony John LaMere. Tony was killed in action on July 1, 1971. I told him to find Panel 3 West Line 96 and to put down tobacco as is our custom. I asked him to offer a prayer for Tony and to tell him it is still a hard way for those of us Native people of this side of Mao-una's creation! I did not tell him of the ATF raid, but I asked that he sing a song for his uncle and for the 300 other Native warriors who names are etched on that wall.

Anthony John LaMere died walking the point position on a combat patrol. He too died defending the Constitution! He carried no boxes of records. How could I not think of that without shaking my head?

Someone told me that there were fully 50 ATF agents who converged

on Winnebago. I and others know little right now but my sense tells me that other Federal and State officials were complicit in violating the sovereignty of our people! I think they need to be ashamed of themselves and when we see them we will tell them so! There is no public outcry! It will begin here and now for many reasons, not the least of which is Nebraska's complicity, always complicity in going after Indian people... even their own.

In 1999 ninety of Nebraska's finest and forty federal officers met 2500 Lakota people who were marching to Whiteclay, NE to pray and to call for an end to the lawlessness and murder in that village. Whiteclay existed only to sell beer onto the dry Pine Ridge Indian Reservation where there is no legal place to drink it! They arrested Russell Means, myself and seven others on that hot July day and I never knew why until much later! We wanted all to sober up, to get well and to bring our families back together! I thought we should have all been given awards for trying to make things better! Instead we were man-handled, arrested, but never convicted of anything but walking across the Nebraska border! I was more hopeful then and more naive! We would all come to know that like Winnebago who is taking on Big Tobacco, we were taking on Big Alcohol! It took us 20 years, but we did not go away, and we did not lose! Even when we constituted a majority of one!

Speaking of Whiteclay, we have come to know that the beer sellers there have seemingly done an "end run" on State and Federal taxes that has resulted in a potential tax claim of over \$600,000 in a recent two-year period! Take that times the 20 years I have watched, and it is not a great leap to think that an audit there of four white beer sellers would dwarf that amount of tax dollars that are in dispute at Winnebago! Did we send a SWAT team to Whiteclay or send a letter in the mail? We all know the answer to that!

In 2017 thousands of Native and non-Native "water protectors" went to Standing Rock to protect our Mother Earth. "Mni Wiconi" they said! "Water is life." They stood up for all Nebraskans and all Americans! Because of that they were attacked by dogs and had water hoses turned on them! I came to know that our Governor had sent members of our State Patrol to go fight those Indians and supporters who opposed the TransCanada Pipeline! Winnebagoes were at Standing Rock! So was my son! I am angry that Nebraska was complicit! We are always complicit when going after our own!

Whether it be the Big Alcohol jackals preying on the vulnerable at Whiteclay, the Big Oil interests poisoning our life blood at Standing Rock or the Big Tobacco money changers taking away jobs at Winnebago for scores of families who have dependent children like we all do...Nebraska always stands with the Big Guys against the rest of us!

I am afraid of the money interests and those they send to intimidate us every time we turn around! I do not want to be slapped! But you know what? When you slap me, I will not be afraid anymore! Neither will Nebraskans who have had enough of the bullies! ATF always engages in high drama! They have become "drama kings." They used to work in the public trust! Their leaders, Nebraskans, or somebody needs to remind them of that!

## Start Planning Now to Apply for the Winnebago Public Schools Academy!

All 6th grade students who are residents of Winnebago no matter what school they currently attend or students who are already enrolled at Winnebago Public Schools no matter where their district of residence is are welcome to apply for the Winnebago Public Schools Academy beginning the 2018-2019 school year. Applications will be available beginning March 1, 2018 at the school. Applications will be due on April 3, 2018. Notification of the selected candidates will be made by May 18, 2018.

There will be an Academy information night for interested students and their parents/guardians to attend and find out more details. The information night will be on Wednesday, February 28, 2018. Please join us in the library at 6:00 p.m.

### How are students selected for the Academy?

The selection criteria are based on the following:

1. Grade point average
2. Test scores
3. Attendance
4. Behavior
5. Teacher referral
6. Essay
7. Completed application packet turned in by due date

Each of the criteria is awarded points. The students will be ranked according to the total points they receive. The top 12-16 students will be accepted into the Academy. All other students will be placed on a waiting list.

### What is the Academy?

The Academy is set up in grade level cohorts with the same teacher providing the primary instruction for the first three years in the program. Students will be taking advanced coursework and some courses that will earn high school credits in the 7th & 8th grades. The goal is to prepare the Academy students to either earn transfer credits to a 4 year college or university, or if interested, to work on earning an Associate's degree through Little Priest Tribal College their last two years of high school while they are

still enrolled at Winnebago Public Schools.

The overriding philosophy of the Academy is that each student should be a contributing member of their tribe and the nation. The Academy also follows the Winnebago Public Schools mission statement of "Learners Today... Leaders Tomorrow." The Academy is set up to assist students in learning to communicate, to collaborate, and to contribute in truly meaningful ways.

*When we think of the Academy some of the words we want to describe it are:* high expectations, enrichment, enhancement, encouragement, skills for life-long learning, love of learning, contributing adults, empowerment, student-centered, pride, and project-based.

Participate in instrumental music at least the first two years of the academy

Study 2 years of World Language

## SUICIDE IN INDIAN COUNTRY PART 14

*Mental Illness and Suicide*

Although the great majority of people who suffer from a mental illness do not die by suicide, having a mental illness does increase the likelihood of suicide compared to people who do not have one.

An estimated 2-15 % of persons who have been diagnosed with major depression die by suicide. Suicide risk is highest in depressed individuals who feel hopeless about the future, those who have just been discharged from the hospital, those who have a family history of suicide and those who have made a suicide attempt in the past.

An estimated 3-20% of persons who have been diagnosed with bipolar disorder die by suicide. Hopelessness, recent hospital discharge, family history, and prior suicide attempts all raise the risk of suicide in these individuals.

An estimated 6-15% of persons diagnosed with schizophrenia die by suicide. Suicide is the leading cause of premature death in those diagnosed with schizophrenia. Between 75 and 95% of these individuals are male.

Also at high risk are individuals who suffer from depression at the same time as another mental illness. Specifically, the presence of substance abuse, anxiety disorders, schizophrenia and bipolar disorder put those with depression at greater risk for suicide.

People with personality disorders are approximately three times as likely to die by suicide than those without. Between 25 and 50% of these individuals also have a substance abuse disorder or major depressive disorder.

People who die by suicide are frequently suffering from undiagnosed, undertreated, or untreated depression.
