## Winnebago Girls Wrestling Program Makes History at State Tournament

WINNEBAGO, NE—Winnebago Public School (WPS) Senior and team captain Zeria George is the back-to-back Nebraska Scholastic Wrestling Coaches Association (NSWCA) Girl's State Champion. George was crowned the State Champion in her weight class of 240 pounds at the Girls State Tournament in York on January 30th. This is George's second consecutive State Championship, last year, as a Junior, George wrestled in the 240-pound class

at the NSAA-sanctioned boys meets. George was the first Female State Wrestling Champion in the State of Nebraska. "I am extremely proud of Zeria and her commitment to her senior year, and the leadership she modeled in the wrestling room and for the other wrestlers" said Adam Tranmer the WPS Head Wrestling Coach. George's State Championship caps off her senior season with an undefeated record of 16-0 with 16 pins. George will be wrestling at the 195 weight class over the weekend to at-

tempt to make it to districts. If she places in the top 4 at districts she will qualify for the NSAA State tournament. Freshman Darian Earth places 4th place in the 190 weight class at the NSWCA Girls State Wrestling. "For a freshman to place that high against some girls who were seniors and have more experience, is a great accomplishment" stated Tranmer. Earth finished her freshman season with a record of 11-7. The team of two girls placed 9th with 44 points.

The WPHD is offering the COVID-19 vaccine to those 16 years and older who meet the following criteria:


- Must live within the Winnebago Service Delivery Area (Winnebago Reservation, Dakota County, Dixon County, Woodbury County, or City of Wayne, NE).
- Be an active patient at Twelve Clans Unity Hospital and/or the Winnebago Public Health Department.
- Be willing to receive the initial vaccine AND booster vaccine 3 weeks later.
- Employees who work in Winnebago are also eligible.

## Employee Spotlight

**JULIE ELBERT**  
(Director, Winnebago Behavioral Health Department)

Julie Elbert is the Director of the Winnebago Behavioral Health Department. Julie recently passed her certification and is now a Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CDAC) in the State of Iowa. Becoming a CDAC required her to complete 36 hours of face-to-face supervision, 500 hours of core function performance, 150 hours of specific training, and passing an exam. Julie holds both a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree in Social Work with the ability to diagnose and treat mental health disorders. With her new certification, she has the capability to treat patients with a dual diagnosis (for example, patients who may be struggling with depression or anxiety and a problem with substance use). It is common for individuals to have a dual diagnosis and without identifying both, a patient may not get well. "With my certification, I am more aware of what symptoms to look for. I am also up to date with regards to appropriate interventions and determining the level of care that may be needed," said Julie. Congrats to Julie on her new certification and we are grateful for your hard work and dedication to providing the best care possible to patients!

# TRIBAL RESOLUTIONS

## RESOLUTION # 21-55

AMENDMENTS TO THE WINNEBAGO TRIBAL CODE  
TITLE 5 ARTICLE 2 – ELECTIONS

PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL VOTE TO DETERMINE A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL FOR APPOINTMENT TO FILL A TRIBAL COUNCIL VACANCY

WHEREAS, the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984), (25 U.S.C. § 5123) as amended by the Act of June 15, 1935, (49 Stat. 378), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, the governing body of the Tribe shall be the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV Section 1(k) of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, and its inherent powers of self-government, the Tribal Council is vested with the power, inter alia, "To regulate the manner of making nominations and holding elections for tribal office"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article V of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, and its inherent powers of self-government, the Tribe has the authority to supervise all elections held under and by virtue of its Constitution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI Section 1 of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, and its inherent powers of self-government, if a councilmember is removed from office, dies, or resigns, "the Tribal Council by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote shall declare the position vacant and shall appoint by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote a qualified individual to fill the position until the next general election at which time the qualified voters shall vote to fill such position for the unexpired term"; and

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 1 of the Bylaws of the Winnebago Tribe provides that "Members of the Council must be twenty-five (25) years of age or over, bona fide residents of the Winnebago Reservation in Nebraska; it is provided further that the Tribal Council shall be the judge of the qualifications of its own members"; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council enacted Title 5, Article 2 of the Winnebago Tribal Code to provide direction in its election process, including further establishing the qualification of candidates for Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to amend Title 5, Article 2 of the Winnebago Tribal Code to establish a procedure for the Winnebago membership to determine a "qualified individual" for the Tribal Council to appoint the vacant Tribal Council seat until the next general election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby amends the Winnebago Tribal Code Title 5 Article 2 – Elections as set forth below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 5-222(4) shall be amended to now read as follows:

4. Unexpired terms to fill all vacancies on the Tribal Council shall be filled as set forth herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a new Section 5-227 shall be adopted and read as follows:

5-227 Special Vote to Determine Qualified Individual to Fill a Vacancy.

In the event a councilmember is removed from office, dies, or resigns, and the Tribal Council, by a 2/3rds affirmative vote, declares the position vacant, then a Special Vote shall be held within twenty-one (21) calendar days to determine a qualified individual" to fill the vacancy until the next general election.

The Tribal Council shall establish the candidate list, provided that all such persons must meet the criteria for Tribal Council candidates set forth in Section 5-204(1).

The Tribal Council shall provide a certified list of candidates for the vacant position. The secretary of the Tribal Council shall post a list of candidates in respective locations as defined in Section 5-203 of this Article at least seven days prior to the Special Vote.

The Tribal Council shall appoint a seven-member election board not less than ten days prior to the Special Vote. The election board shall be comprised of those offices set forth in Section 5-202(2), shall have those duties set forth in Section 5-207, and shall be compensated at the same rate provided for in Section 5-209. If practicable, the election board shall be the same persons from the most recent Regular Election unless a new election board has been appointed for the upcoming Regular Election. In such case, the election board shall be the newly appointed election board.

All persons on the Eligible Voter List from the most recent Regular Election shall be entitled to vote in the Special Vote.

A person may vote for one candidate per vacancy. Spoiled ballots shall not be counted.

There shall be no write-in candidates in the Special Vote.

The person with the highest number of votes shall be declared to be a "qualified individual" to fill the position until the next general election.

The Tribal Council shall vote to appoint the "qualified individual" to fill the vacant position until the next general election.

In the event there is a tie, the Tribal Council shall vote on the top vote getters to determine the "qualified individual." Once the "qualified individual" is determined, the Tribal Council shall vote to appoint that person to fill the vacant position until the next general election.

No person shall be seated unless there is an affirmative 2/3rds vote of the Tribal Council to appoint that person to fill the vacant seat.

Unless otherwise stated in this Section 5-227, the other provisions of Title 5, Article 2 shall apply.

## RESOLUTION # 21-56

AMENDMENTS TO THE WINNEBAGO TRIBAL CODE  
TITLE 5 ARTICLE 2 – ELECTIONS

ALLOWING VOTERS TO VOTE FOR ALL VACANT SEATS, WHETHER EXPIRED OR UNEXPIRED

WHEREAS, the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984), (25 U.S.C. § 5123) as amended by the Act of June 15, 1935, (49 Stat. 378), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, the governing body of the Tribe shall be the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV Section 1(k) of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, and its inherent powers of self-government, the Tribal Council is vested with the power, inter alia, "To regulate the manner of making nominations and holding elections for tribal office"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article V of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, and its inherent powers of self-government, the Tribe has the authority to supervise all elections held under and by virtue of its Constitution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI Section 1 of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution, if a Councilman is removed from office, dies, or resigns, and the Tribal Council declares the position vacant by a 2/3rds vote, the Tribal Council "shall appoint by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote a qualified individual to fill the position until the next general election at which time the qualified voters shall fill such position for the unexpired term"; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council enacted Title 5, Article 2 of the Winnebago Tribal Code to provide direction in its election process; however, Article 2 does not differentiate between expired and unexpired seats for the Tribe's Regular Election, resulting in a scenario where Tribal members are denied the opportunity to vote for all vacancies; and

WHEREAS, amending the Winnebago Tribal Code will provide direction about conducting a Regular Election to the Tribal Council and election board when there are more than three vacant seats on the Tribal Council and allow for Tribal members the opportunity to vote for all vacancies on the ballot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby amends the Winnebago Tribal Code Title 5 Article 2 – Elections as set forth below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 5-205, subsection 1 shall be amended to now read as follows:

The Tribal Council shall provide the reservation election board with official printed ballots (Exhibit #4). The names of qualified candidates shall appear on the official printed election ballots in alphabetical order. A person may vote for up to one candidate per the number of vacancies. A voter may vote for a person or persons (up to the number of vacancies) not appearing on the published ballot by writing the name of said person or persons legibly on the ballot.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 5-222 shall be amended to delete subsection 6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a new Section 5-226 shall be adopted and read as follows:

5-226 Unexpired Seats on the Ballot.

Pursuant to Article VI, Section 3 of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Winnebago Tribe, when a councilmember is removed from office, dies, or resigns, the Tribal Council, by a 2/3rds affirmative vote, declares the position vacant and, by a 2/3rds affirmative vote, appoints a qualified individual to fill the position until the next general election.

In the event there is an unexpired Tribal Council seat on the ballot for the Regular Election, such seat(s) shall be included on the ballot as one of the vacancies.

Voters may vote for all of the regular expired seats as well as all of the unexpired seats.

The next highest vote getter(s) following the vacant expired seats shall be declared elected for the unexpired seat for the remainder of the unexpired term.

In the event of a tie, a runoff election shall be held pursuant to Section 5-222.

# WARHORSE™

Ho-Chunk, Inc.'s gaming division is previewing 3D design concepts and logos for the new casinos as planning advances at three Nebraska locations – Omaha, Lincoln and South Sioux City.

WarHorse Gaming LLC is a subsidiary of Ho-Chunk, Inc., and is the organization working with the Nebraska Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) to bring the casinos into reality. Ho-Chunk, Inc. is owned by the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska.

Expanded gaming in some form is expected by late 2021 at some race track locations, with full casino operations up and running in 2022.

Design concepts for the WarHorse South Sioux will be announced later this year.

The new WarHorse casinos will advance Ho-Chunk, Inc.'s mission of creating economic opportunity for Tribal members, and help fund Winnebago community programs and partnerships.



## WARHORSE CASINO LOGOS UNVEILED

WarHorse Gaming and its WarHorse Casino locations will operate under a new logo just announced. The modern symbol helps represent the consistent, top-notch experience guests can expect no matter which casino they visit.

"The logo could be interpreted either way – as Native or non-Native," said Lance Morgan, Ho-Chunk, Inc. CEO.

**"We wanted the casinos and their logo to be contemporary and modern, not some country-western or horse feel."**

The logo was designed to be emblematic of the partnership between Ho-Chunk, Inc. and the Nebraska HBPA, which owns several of the race tracks where the casinos will be built.



## MEET BRIAN CAMBERLAIN WARHORSE GAMING'S NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



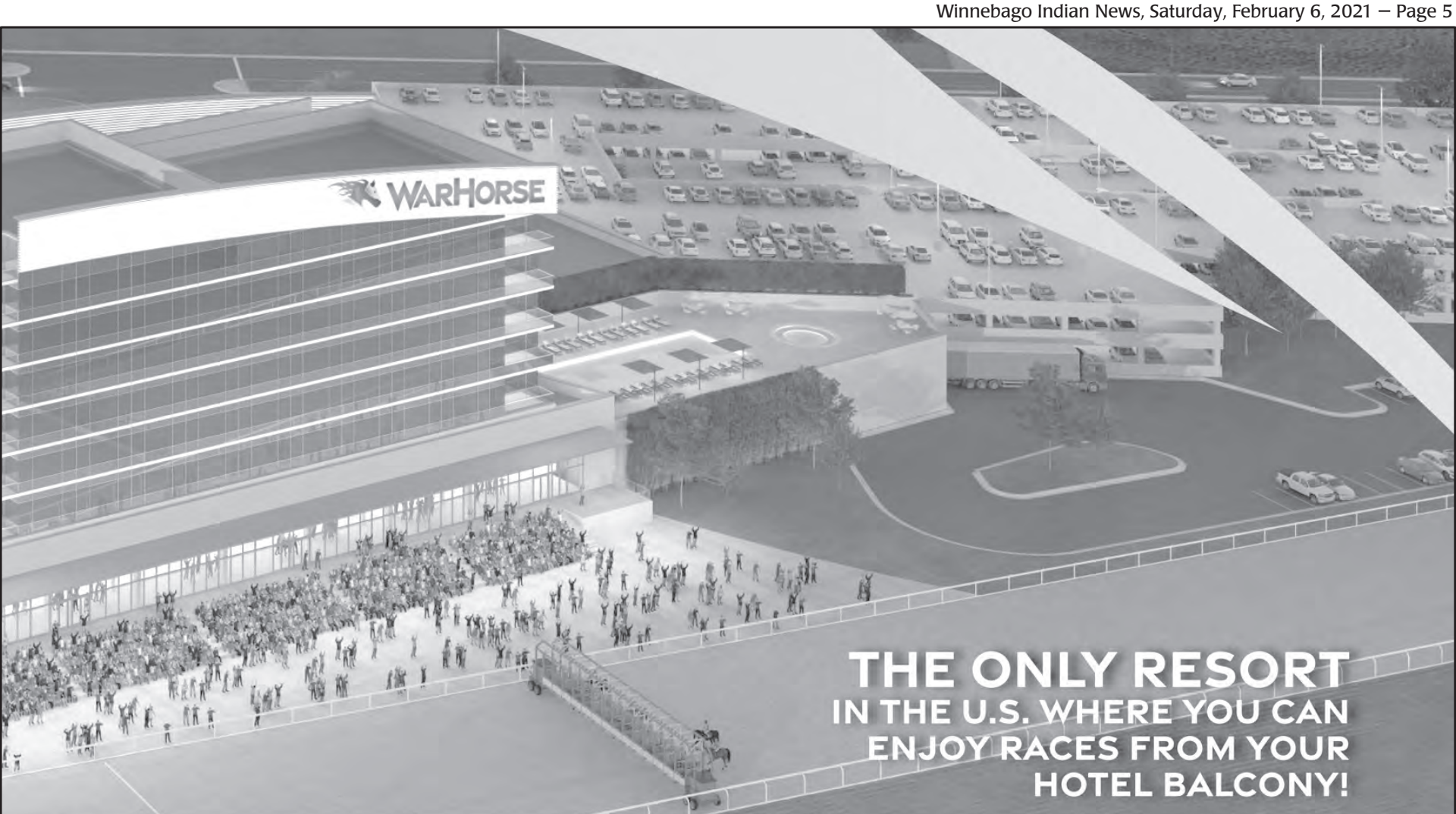
WarHorse Gaming's executive director is Brian Chamberlain, an enrolled member of the Winnebago Tribe who brings key experience to the new role.

His work in gaming began in 1993 when he started as a blackjack dealer at WinnaVegas.

**"We used to be in the trailers. For those who may not remember, that was an exciting time for the Tribe's growth, but also a very different time,"** Brian said.

He went on to become the CEO of the Winnebago Gaming Development Corporation from 2004 to 2020, leaving for the new role with WarHorse Gaming.

Brian's history with Ho-Chunk, Inc. includes serving as a board member for the first time in 2003. He is also Vice Chairman of the Winnebago Tribe and has served with past and present Tribal Council terms since 2008. Brian has also served two terms with the Winnebago Gaming Commission.

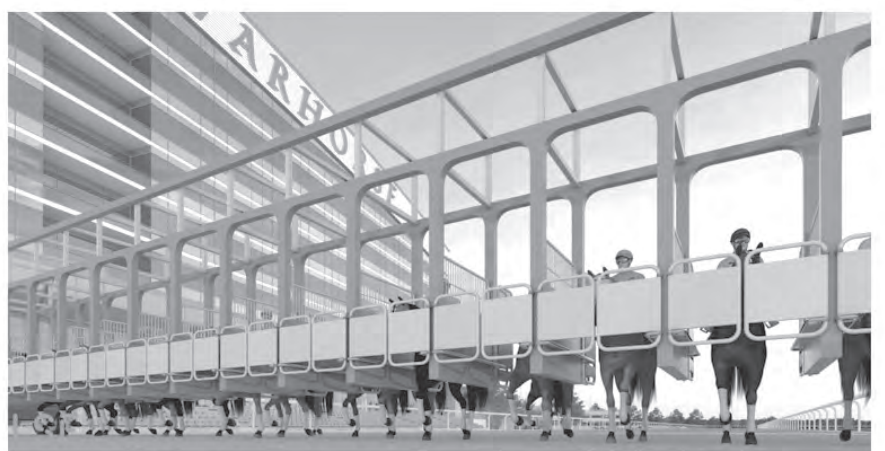

## LINCOLN

The largest of the planned casinos is the impressive new WarHorse Lincoln which will be constructed at the Lincoln Race Course complex in a hotel-style casino-resort and include roof-top race track viewing. The casino will have 1,500 gaming positions.

**“I’m calling WarHorse Lincoln the crown jewel. Lincoln as a city is a destination for a lot of activities, and this location is going to have a different level of visibility,”** Brian said.



## OMAHA

Omaha with its metro population will help make WarHorse Omaha a star property. The casino will be built at the existing Horseman’s Park, located near the intersection of Q Street and 72nd in South Omaha. The casino will have 1,600 gaming positions.

“WarHorse Omaha will be able to offer a lot of amenities, from standard casino gaming, slots and tables,” Brian said. “We’re going to add other things as they come in, like sports betting will have a sports bar, and various dining venues.”

## My Fellow Tribal Members,



proud to reiterate the changes we've made to our tribal election code. Never again will we have someone sitting at our council table that no one voted for. Never again will the votes of our people be ignored to create the seating of someone that did not carry the favor of our voters. Our election system must be without corruption. It cannot be tampered with and must carry serious penalties for anyone who disrupts the will of our people's votes. Most importantly, it must be inclusive of our membership to reflect the will of our people as we select our leaders and representation.

If you're not aware, in January the Council approved changes to the election code that provide for the appropriate filling of any vacancy by mean of holding a Special Vote. The winner(s) of that vote will be declared the 'eligible candidate(s)' and the remaining Council SHALL then appoint the winner(s). With previous Councils proving that we cannot count on any council to do the right thing, this new council took the matter out of the political will of some and gave the voice back to our people – where it always belongs!

There are still many more changes coming but giving the vote back to our people was priority number one for me, and I'm elated to help deliver that result to you.

The next matter is a short one, but important, nonetheless. We have always been known as the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska. But over the years I've heard many names bandied about, many of which included the word, "Nation". I have to say it's a bit embarrassing to see the phrasing on the Iowa interstate signage that calls us the "Nation of the Winnebago Tribe". Now I understand some people have fallen in love with the word nation, but is this what we're stuck with? I hope not. If we're not the Winnebago Tribe, and you're in love with the word 'nation', why not Hockak Nisoc haci Nation? Let's argue about it. Just kidding.

The final topic for today is healthcare and the vaccines. Knowing many of you are worried and knowing that many have even more questions I hope that you all will seriously consider taking the vaccine. I have. Now please consult your own doctors for specific questions related to your own healthcare needs, but my point is letting you know that I believe we will only defeat this virus by protecting ourselves using every weapon we have. Before the vaccine we had only hygiene and isolation, which are good, but now we have science, and soon we'll have even more. So, think about it. If you still have questions call the hospital or read the literature put out through their efforts on social media and the like. We will defeat this virus and we will emerge victorious from this pandemic. Help protect our people by doing your part in what ever way makes the most sense for you and yours.

Finally, I want to thank you all again for your continued support. Working on behalf of our people is my honor. It is something that I hold in very high esteem and is a job that I take very seriously. Just as what we're allowed to take care of for all of us a very important responsibility, your continued involvement is just as crucial. So, thank you all, again, and please continue to stay involved and support the positive actions of your council in the ways that benefits each of us. Don't forget I also do regular videos on my Facebook page, Fmr. Vice-Chairman Brian Chamberlain, and I will continue to communicate with you in all media possible.

Stay safe, wash your hands, wear your masks, stay distanced when possible. Thank you.

I hope this finds you in good health and spirit. Winnebago has a lot of potential. There is quite a bit of activity occurring which traverses the varied areas within which our tribe asserts itself. Let's touch on a few of those areas today.

Starting with our Nebraska gaming efforts, the tribe is in a unique position to expand a business area that we have quite a bit of expertise in and awareness of for the first time in many years. Given most of our experience is within the tenets of Indian Gaming on the Federal level, the Nebraska efforts will have the distinction of being a part of an entirely new system. What's great for us in this aspect is that not only are we capable of owning and operating casinos, we're also quite adept at regulating them. This approach will create a new level of cooperation toward the State system that most competitors will simply not be able to meet.

Coming forward from the Keep the Money in Nebraska (KTMN) effort spearheaded by HoChunk, Inc. and our partners from the HBPA, the ballot initiatives passed this last November opened the door to what I'm sure will be a whole new ballgame of sorts for the tribe. The opportunities that we are creating will have such an immense reach, the depth of those areas we are only beginning to imagine. Job opportunities are very real and present. From those jobs our people can create for themselves homes, educational opportunities, and lifestyles that return our people to the prosperous status we know to be true when our people work together for the betterment and support of us all.

As a wholly owned tribal company, HoChunk, Inc., is uniquely qualified to provide to the new Nebraska system a gaming collaboration made up entirely of Nebraska partners, using Nebraska resources, offered by Nebraska residents. When we said, Keep the Money in Nebraska, we meant it! Ironically, we may also see that not all the licensed locations for new casinos in Nebraska will use the 100% Go Big Red Born and Raised Nebraska model we offer. It will be difficult for those who choose non-Nebraska partners to claim ever again that they too Bleed Husker Red like our tribal model will when they've chosen non-Nebraska based partnerships using the doors opened by our efforts.

The next area to discuss is our tribal government. Good or bad, right, or wrong, we are all in this together. Stated plainly, I reject out of hand any claims that we are terminally divided. Yes it's true, there are efforts to sustain division and sow discord – even from those around the table. But I choose to see the better in our people, the good will that we share toward one another, and the board context of our teachings that tell us to "be good to one another".

Now our government needs work. And in some cases, it needs a complete overhaul, which is why I'm very

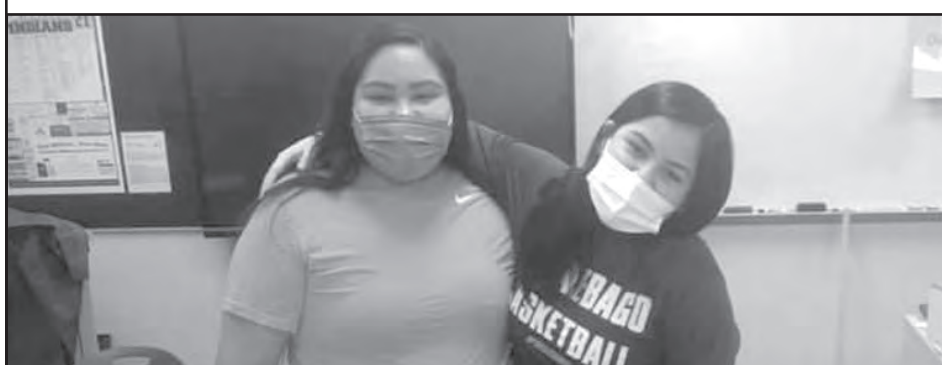
